# Reading Together



### What is 'Reading Together'?

- a 4 week (1 hour per week) programme
- for adults (though a creche is available to look after children)
- helps adults support their children with their home reading
- explains the reading process in layman's terms
- gives adults simple strategies to help their children (& themselves)
- eliminates the fuss & frustration that can happen when neither party is sure what to do / how to help
- is it also good for adults who of course want the best for their children but sometimes without realising it, are putting too much pressure on their kids (children will then ingeniously avoid reading at home)

I've been running this programmes for the 10 years and have had positive feedback from parents/caregivers.

"It has made reading at home so much better - fun even!" "She's more confident & keen to read."

"He's gone up 2 reading levels."

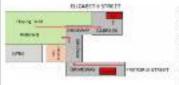




# **Rotorua Intermediate School** Open Evening 530pm to 630pm
