COVID-19 Update

Thank you for your support during the Alert Level 2 period. We will continue to observe and apply the public health routines that are in place at Malfroy School.

Key points about Alert Level 1

- We need to have systems and practices in place in case COVID-19 reappears in our community.

- We must continue to support contact tracing through the display of QR Code posters and our visitor sign-in, attendance register and timetable.
- Schools, like workplaces, are not considered to be gatherings. Physical activities including cultural and sporting activities, practices, and events can go ahead.
- Public health measures continue such as hand hygiene, cough and sneeze etiquette.
- Regularly cleaning and disinfecting high touch surfaces.
- Face coverings continue to not be required when in school. Anyone who chooses to wear a face covering in any setting should be supported to do so.

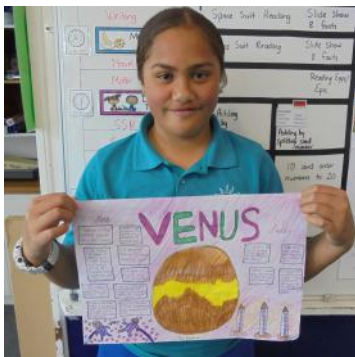
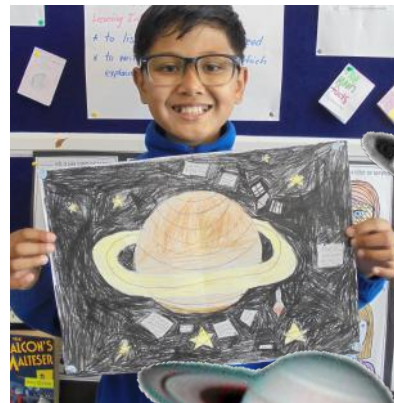
