COVID-19 Updates

Learning Resources for Students

Thank you to staff and parents/caregivers for your commitment this week in preparing and distributing learning resources for students in the form of hard packs.

An exemption was granted to schools to allow staff to go on site and access learning resources.

A total of 292 hard packs were prepared by staff on Monday morning. In the afternoon a total of 178 packs (60%) were distributed from the school hall at staggered times which allowed for a smooth transition.

Everyone followed the public health requirements. Thank you!

Later that afternoon and Tuesday morning a team of 7 staff dropped off the remaining 114 packs (40%) throughout the Rotorua area.

We do know from teachers feedback that most students and parents/caregivers have been in contact with teachers via text, phone call, email and Seesaw.

Malfroy School online Survey

Thanks to Whaea Ngareta, this survey was sent out over the weekend and the results highlighted that many of our students have access to a shared device and most homes have internet access.

- √ 143 responses
- √ 70% of children have access to a device at home
- √ 39% share a device at home
- √ 99% have internet access

We will review our plan for learning resources after tomorrow's announcement by the government regarding the current Alert Level 4. If there is a change to Alert Level 3, here are the requirements for Early Learning Service, Schools and Kura:

Education at Alert Level 3

- At Alert Level 3, tamariki (children) and young people should learn from home. Schools will be open for those tamariki (children) whose parents or carers need to go to work.
- Play centres and playgroups must close.
- Schools should provide distance learning options for all tamariki (children) and young people who are learning from home, including those tamariki (children) who need to self-isolate and cannot attend school.
- Schools may set up bubbles to help maintain physical distancing in the classroom and outside.

 Parents, carers and whānau who are visitors to the school should keep 2 metres apart from people outside their household.

If the COVID-19 lockdown remains in place at Alert Level 4 we will organise another hard pack next week. There will be some senior and middle students who do not have access to a device. Please contact your child's teacher if this is the case.










Senior Swimming: We managed to get in sessions of swimming before lockdown. In that short time frame instructors commented on how quickly students were improving. Well done Room 9!



Lockdown 2021


Once again we have been hit with covid 19. Room 9 have continued to work online and utilising the school hard packs.


